Students in Year 11 will receive a grade and written feedback throughout the year as stated below. In addition to the assessment recorded, students will also assess themselves and their peers to aid to the progression of their work based on teacher lead assessment objectives. Students' assessment and personal progress sheets will be stored in group folders that will remain in the classroom. Students and teachers will have access to these every lesson. Students and teachers will record verbal feedback on their assessment and personal progress sheets.
