What will I learn?

You will learn how to analyse the linguistic and structural techniques writers use and develop your own personal responses to literary texts.

You will explore a range of contemporary texts and writing from our literary heritage.

In Year 11 you will study *An Inspector Calls* as well as revise the following texts from Year 10:

- *Romeo and Juliet*
- Conflict poetry from the AQA Anthology
- A 19th-century novel.

How will I be assessed?

Throughout Year 11, you will continue complete a range practice exam-style assessments. These will take place in lesson time to build your confidence and skills when answering each of the different question types. You will complete two full mock exam papers in Year 11 to prepare fully for the final examinations. 100% final examination (2 examinations)

How will I be taught?

English Literature is taught alongside English Language and students will undertake both qualifications, achieving two GCSE certificates.
