
## Philosophy & Ethics at King Edward VI School

Task 3: The 10 commandments. Most Christians live life by the 10 commandments. These are: 1. You shall have no other Gods but me. 2. You shall not have any other idols. 3. You shall not misuse the name of the Lord. 4. You shall remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy (day of rest and worship). 5. Respect your Father and Mother. 6. You must not commit murder. 7. You must not commit adultery. 8. You must not steal. 9. You must not give false evidence against your neighbor. 10. You must not be jealous of what someone else has.

- A) Which commandment do you think is most important? Why?
- B) Which one do you think is most difficult? Why?
- C) Do you think everyone follows the 10 commandments today? Why? (Try to give some examples)
- D) Using the template on the next page, come up with your own 10 commandments on how you want to live your life. It could be about your religion, beliefs, hobbies, justice, inequality or something else you want to change.
