

On the next page, you will find a chart showing the symbol, holy book, place of worship and founder of each religion. However, they have got themselves a little mixed up! Could you draw a line to connect the religion with the correct item on the list. You could use different colours for each religion to make it easier to follow the line. One has been done for you and here are some clues for the rest:

Symbols:

The Jewish symbol has 6 lines of symmetry. The symbol for Islam comes out at night. The Sikh symbol looks quite sharp. The Hindu symbol look like a number with a tail! You should know the Christian one.

Holy book:

The Jewish book could sound like a lion. The book of Islam has punctuation. The Sikh book has 5 syllables. You should know the Christian one. The Hindu book is the one that's left!







Place of Worship:

The Jewish place has two silent letters at the end. The Muslim place (this is Islam) has one syllable. The Sikh place starts with the same letter as their holy book. The Hindu place sound like a girl's name if you take off the last letter. The Christian one you should know.

Founder: - This means the person who started the religion.

The Jewish founder has the same name as an American president. The Muslim founder has three consonants that are the same in his name. The Sikh founder's name has the same first word as their holy book. The Hindu founder doesn't exist! You should know who started Christianity.
