Dear Parents and Carers

As we move further from the challenges of the pandemic it is essential that we return to the normal patterns of attendance which we know are essential to high quality education.

Every day of education missed leaves four areas of the national curriculum uncovered which may damage your child's education at a later date. Also, if there are two or three students always missing every lesson, then it is difficult to provide the learning continuity which students in the best schools enjoy.

40% of students are between 96-100% attendance however many students are being put at a disadvantage by missing too many days.

Library


For those who have not yet seen, our Library has a selection of new colourful, contemporary, yet comfortable chairs!
