Student Voice

Throughout last year, Ria Taher from Suffolk County Council's Children & Young People's Service Engagement Hub met with a group of


students to promote their voice within school and external community projects. Please see below a summary of what the Student's Voice, (CAT Network) achieved the last academic year.

Firstly, a big topic for the students was ableism and describing some microaggressions that occur in school and the impacts that these have on mental/emotional health and well-being. A student created a survey. Overall, they felt that a safe space to talk to trusted adults is important, they wanted to feel listened to and see that the matter is taken seriously.

They spoke about the importance of everyone having more awareness about racism, sexism, ableism and homophobia.

The students created a poster for display in school.





Our students also helped to develop our <u>Suffolk</u> <u>Source Website</u> for young people.



The Source provides information, advice, and support for young people in Suffolk. This has been co-produced with young people, they looked at the relevant pages and fed into the content.

Finally, Student Voice ended the year with some of the members of the group joining forces with the Youth Parliament.

Student Voice attended the British Youth Council YouthCon event in London with the Youth Parliament. They particularly enjoyed the debate section and finding out some key tips on negotiation.

Road works In Spring Lane next week
