

Literacy Festival Bury St Edmunds

On the weekend commencing Friday 20 October, Bury Literary Festival are hosting a range of local authors in the Unitarian Meeting House on Churchgate street.

All events are **free** for under 18s but tickets for under 18s <u>must be booked in advance</u>. This would be an excellent opportunity for your child to develop their interest in literature and reading by getting to hear from real local authors.

On Friday evening, there will be an event with poet, Elizabeth Cook, who has recently made a video offering tips to students in our creative writing club on writing poetry. If students sign up for this event and arrive before 6pm, they can sign up for the Open Mic and read their own poetry. Last year, we had several students impress the speaker with their own poems. Ms Reynard and Mr Gaw will be in attendance that evening if any students plan to share their poems and want some support.

Other items that may interest students include:

1. "Your Show" by Ashley Hickson-Lovence -Saturday 21 October at 3pm

A football themed book about being black in white spaces and achieving your goals in the face of adversity. The book is about the Premier League's only black referee.

2. New Voices in Fiction - Sunday 22 October at 3pm

This is panel event which will focus on the how to of being published. Four recent debut authors, Karen Angelico, Eva Verde, Sussie Anie and Rajasree Variyar will talk about studying their route to publication. Something for those with a real interest in taking their creative writing further, but who might not see themselves as 'traditional' authors.

3. "The Leviathan" by Rosie Andrews Sunday 22 October at 6pm

A great book for anyone interested in witch trials and that era of English history. A young man returns home from war in 17th Century England to find that his sister believes their maid to be a witch who has cursed their home. This event will also be hosted by English Subject Lead, Ms Reynard.
