
Exams - Year 11 mock exam timetables




YA Book Group

Kooth



Young people aged 11-25 can use Kooth to seek support or advice on any topic they wish. From managing their feelings or coping with exam stress. Support in relation to bullying and eating disorders is also available as is advice on suicidal thoughts or handling sexual abuse. Kooth allows young people to provide each other with support through online forums. It also provides the ability to contribute to self-help articles and content.

Qualified counsellors are online seven days a week to provide those using the service with online counselling. This could be through chat-

based messaging via drop-in or booked sessions. Young people can also track their mood with a goals tracker as well as note their thoughts in an online journal.
