

NEW! How can I monitor my child's homework?

The successful candidate will



Reading for Pleasure - First Chapters

To try to "hook" students into reading a little more, we have started a "First Chapters" programme during tutor time for Years 7 - 10. Each week, your child's tutor will read out the opening to a young adult novel and generate a conversation about it. Two copies will be put into the school Library and one will be raffled for any students who felt "hooked" by the opening.

Each week, I will include the book's title and a blurb. Feel free to ask your child about the opening. If they seem interested and didn't win the raffle, it may be a perfect opportunity to take them to the wonderful Library in Bury St Edmunds, who will be ordering in multiple copies of the book in connection with this programme. You can find these upstairs in the Young Adult section.



This week's book was called "Boy 87" by Ele Fountain. It is about a refugee child fleeing his country.

"Shif is just an ordinary boy who likes chess, maths and racing his best friends home from school. But one day, soldiers with guns come to his door – and he knows he is no longer safe.

Shif is forced to leave his mother and little sister, and embark on a dangerous journey; a journey through imprisonment and escape, new lands and strange voices, and a perilous crossing by sand and sea. He will encounter cruelty and kindness; he will be separated from the people he loves."

Plan Bee

Understanding and supporting your child or young person with additional needs' sessions.



These sessions will run from 10 until 12pm, on 23 April, 30 April and 7 May.

The school is offering parents the opportunity to attend to attend 'Plan Bee'. This is a 3-week course (2hrs per week) written by two Clinical Psychologists working in Norfolk Community Health and Care who are passionate about supporting parents to understand their children/young people with neurodivergent conditions. They believe all behaviour is a means of communication and the course seeks to understand what your child is communicating in their most anxious moments.

The aim of this course is to help parents and carers to:

- Understand why their child or young person might become overwhelmed.
- Have time to reflect on what might trigger certain distressed behaviours and how to implement pro-active and re-active strategies.
- Develop a support plan which they can share with other family members or carers and with schools to provide a consistent approach.
- Meet with other parents/carers for peer support.

Teen Chill is a project whereby Abbeycroft has been funded by Suffolk Police Crime Commissioners, West Suffolk Council and in partnership with Bury Town Council to provide young people with a safe environment to socialise on Monday evenings. 'Teen Chill' provides a service for young people in Bury St. Edmunds and immediate surrounding areas. Sessions are not structured, instead they allow young people to choose what they want to do...or do nothing. But if they do want to get involved, there's plenty to do and they can suggest activities that they'd like to see added.
