

Holidays and Term Time absences

Term-time absence is a significant factor in children's under-achievement. Children have 13 weeks a year of school holidays – please take them away during this time. Parents do not have the right to take their child out of school for holidays in term-time. **Every child's education in a class is damaged if students miss learning which then needs to be retaught.** If you do require leave, a Leave of Absence form should be completed and returned to school for authorisation well in advance.

If the school refuses a request for a termtime leave of absence and the child is still taken out of school, this will be recorded as an **Unauthorised Absence** on the child's attendance record and school report. A Penalty Notice may be issued, or a referral made to Educational Welfare.

Special mention must go to Sam in Year 8, who brilliantly managed the tactics, formation and


squad rotation. A future National Team Manager for sure! You read it here first!

#### How can I monitor my child's homework?

Following the school's move to MS Teams, we have been working with Microsoft to enable our parents better access to monitor homework set by teachers. Through some testing with parents, we are now able to release this update to the wider community. We have produced a separate guide called 'Microsoft School Connection' which is available on our school website HERE. At this time, we encourage parents not to use student login details, but instead to set up their own account, linking to their child/children as per this guide. As this system verifies parental email addresses through our school data, it is critical that parents ensure that the school have their up-to-date email address(es).
