Thank you to everyone who supported the Performing Arts Showcase last night. The tapestry of talent on display was truly amazing.










RLENS Information


From September 2024, King Edward VI school expects any student in Years 7-10 who has been diagnosed by an optometrist with any of the following perceptual processing disorders:


Tennis County Finals Day

Dan is angry. Nothing has been the same since his big brother left, and he's taking it out on the nearest and weakest target: Alex.


