




Students finished the day by walking through the Þingvellir National Park where the North American and Eurasian plates are separating. They enjoyed the well-earned use of the hotel's outdoor heated swimming pool (heated by geothermal energy).



Day 3, started with a visit to two of Iceland's most amazing waterfalls where the students managed to walk behind one and get rather wet in the process. They headed further south towards the 'Black Sand beach' after stopping to visit a retreating glacier up close. The day finished with group work on what the students had observed over the two days before another relaxing dip in the pool.








Day 4 allowed the group to visit the capital city Reykjavik and stop by some unusual lava craters on route. After some sightseeing, they all headed for the airport and a return to the UK. The students were exceptional in their attitude to the

whole trip and upheld the school's core values to an extremely high standard.


Stress bucket activity – help young people identify what exactly is causing them stress and the things they can do to reduce it.


