

GARDEN ITEMS NEEDED:

- Hand trowels or hand forks
- Broom / dust pan and brush
- Gloves (S-M)
- Old kitchen aprons (to protect uniform)
- Soil sieve / rill
- Trugs / buckets
- Watering cans
- Potting compost (any type) and sand or grit
- Seeds (no plants yet please, as we need to prepare planting areas first)

Road Safety Reminder – Spring Lane Entrance

We would like to remind all students, parents, and staff to take extra care when using the Spring Lane entrance, especially during drop-off and pick-up times.



We've received reports of several near misses involving pedestrians and vehicles in this area. Contributing factors include:

- Gridlock and congestion as cars stop on both sides of the road
- Limited visibility due to the blind corner near the entrance
- Students walking into the road without looking
- Vehicles reversing unexpectedly, creating dangerous situations for both pedestrians and drivers

To help keep everyone safe:

- Please avoid stopping or parking close to the entrance or on both sides of the road
- Encourage children to use designated paths and crossings
- Drive slowly and with extra caution around the entrance

Deadline approaches to apply for Suffolk County Council (SCC) funded transport Please see the message below from Suffolk County Council:

The deadline to opt-in for SCC funded school travel for the 2025/26 school term is fast approaching.

If your child is eligible for SCC funded school travel you will need to **opt-in by 31 May 2025** to receive travel for the start of the 2025/2026 school year.

If your child already receives SCC funded school travel you still need to opt-in every year.

If your child is starting primary or secondary school in September 2025 and they are eligible for SCC funded school travel, you will have received an email with details of how to opt-in.
