We are delighted to announce that we have changed our careers platform from XELLO to Unifrog, courtesy of funding provided to the school by the Foundation Trustees.



The purchase will further support and improve our delivery of careers education in the school, ensuring access for all. Our aim is to increase parental and student engagement with our careers offer and Unifrog will help support this. Unifrog helps students (and parents) understand careers progression through school and onwards through Post-16 to College, University or apprenticeships. It helps explore their interests, enabling them to record any activities, clubs or outside school hobbies etc, which will eventually support their applications. The package will also support them to find education and training opportunities.

In addition, Unifrog enables teachers to keep track of any careers activities students have done, encouraging conversations around their future. Tutors will deliver short lessons during tutor-time, based around student's learning about themselves, exploring possibilities, managing careers, creating opportunities, balancing work and life and seeing the big picture.

Drills at King Edwards

For your information, please see below procedures we have in place for both Fire Evacuations and Security Lockdowns. As part of our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students and staff, it is essential that clear protocols are followed in the event of an emergency.

Fire Evacuation Procedure

In the event of a fire alarm:

- The alarm will sound and all staff and students will evacuate the buildings promptly.
- Everyone will assemble in the designated areas in front of the Astro/4G pitch.
- Students are expected to walk calmly, silently, and with purpose.
- Upon arrival at the assembly point, students will line up in their tutor groups in alphabetical order and remain silent.
- Registers will be taken to ensure everyone is accounted for.
- Staff will then provide further instructions, which will usually involve returning to classrooms once it is safe to do so.

We carry out regular fire drills throughout the year. All year groups have now participated in a walkthrough of the procedure with their Head of Year and Tutor. A full-school fire drill will take place within the next couple of weeks.

Security Lockdown Procedure

Schools are also required to have a clear procedure for a security lockdown, which differs from a fire evacuation in that students remain inside the building.

In the event of a security lockdown:

- A distinctive alarm will sound five consecutive buzzes – to indicate a lockdown.
- Teachers will immediately close and lock classroom doors and windows.
- Students must follow their teacher's instructions at all times.
- The lockdown will end when three consecutive buzzes are heard.

This week, students will watch a video presented by a member of staff that clearly explains both the Fire Evacuation and Security Lockdown procedures. This will ensure all students understand what is expected of them during a real event or a drill.

Student Wellbeing

We understand that some students may find these procedures or drills distressing. If you feel your child may be affected in this way, please contact us so that we can make alternative arrangements and provide appropriate support. Thank you for your continued support in helping us maintain a safe environment for all members of our school community.

Road Safety

The number of child pedestrian casualties double when students are travelling independently, with incidents more likely to happen during school drop-off and pick up times.



Since the start of term, we have already had a number of reports from members of the public regarding near misses during these times. Examples include scooting dangerously in the middle of the road, cycling with earphones in, helmets being attached to the child's bag rather than protecting their head and a student running in front of a moving car.

Please take this opportunity to remind your child about the principles of road safety and independent travel as it may save their life.

The following links may help to provide some simple tips to share, focusing in on the top 3 risky behaviours (based on the top contributory factors assigned to child pedestrian casualties):

Pedestrian failure to look / distraction (friends and mobiles).

Pedestrian careless, reckless or in a hurry. Safe place to cross (including parked cars and behind buses).


