From Thursday 9 October, Bury Literary Festival are hosting a range of local authors in the Unitarian Meeting House on Churchgate Street as well as several other venues around Bury St Edmunds.

TikTok - Recommending Adult Content to Children





With the Online Safety Act now in force, it should be no surprise that companies are under a lot of scrutiny right now, with their failings in safety settings being highlighted in the media.

This week saw the outcomes of some new research by a campaign group called Global Witness. As part of their research, they set up a number of fake accounts as a 13-year-old and importantly, they turned on the 'restricted mode' feature, which is supposed to restrict certain content, however it didn't. The research showed the user was actively shown highly inappropriate content using similar words to circumvent the safety features with ease, such as corn not porn.
